ABOUT THE LABORATORY

In 1894, Dr. E.L. Trudeau founded the Saranac Laboratory for the study of tuberculosis, the first of its kind in the nation. The stone and steel laboratory served as a center for scientific research on TB and other lung diseases until its closure in 1964, when the modern Trudeau Institute was established.
